- Needs for harmonization and comparability in curriculums & syllabus, teaching mythology, and evaluation systems, with other universities in the region
- Needs for consistent and congruent with the needs and expectations of students, all other stakeholders and society
- Inadequate financial support
- Improving student-teacher ratio

- To set-up QA team including department QA cells and define their duties and responsibilities in every Universities
- To start the fast track with possible program area
- To implement simple form with lean staff
- To promote awareness and comprehension on QA principles, criteria, and outcomes
- To promote self-motivation through realizing the results of QA practices
