## International Collaboration

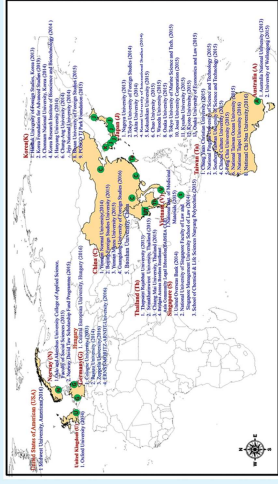
The University has in recent years developed extensive cooperation with some of the leading universities in the world that aim to transform teaching, research and administration.
