

- 1958 Faculty of Agriculture under Mandalay University
- 1964 A separate university known as the "Institute of Agriculture"
- 1973 Moved from Mandalay to Yezin
- 1978 Set up of the Master Courses
- 1993 Management transferred to the Ministry of Agriculture and Irrigation
- 1996 Reorganization of Horticulture and Agricultural Economics Departments
- 1998 Renamed as "Yezin Agricultural University (YAU)"
- 1999Diamond Jubilee Celebation of its
foundation on 22 December, 1924
- 2001 Set up of Ph.D. courses
