

What is needed at home university

- Student exchange agreements
- Mobility windows in the different programs
- Possibility to transfer the credits
- Willingness of sending out and receiving students





Process for outbound student mobility

Before the exchange

- Spread information about exchange studies
- Application to home university for an exchange place abroad
- Application to host university (with help from coordinator at home)
- Pre-departing meeting

During the exchange

Help out if emergency situations occurs, course changes, mid-term checks etc

After the exchange

- Send out a "Welcome home" email /Exchange reports
- Follow ups if needed
- Guidance of writing CV:s etc. (Study- and Career Services)





Different options

- Departments and subject specific departmental agreements
- Faculties and faculty agreements
- The Division for Internationalisation and university wide agreements







Application rounds

15 October - 15 November

(for studies commencing the next autumn). Focus: Asia, Europe, Middle East, North America, Some additional places to other regions as well

15 April – 15 May

(for studies commencing the next spring). Focus: Africa, Oceania, Latin Amerika Some additional places to other regions as well

Reasons for two application rounds:

- Early deadlines to some partner universities
- Start of the academic year
- Possibility to handle left over places







Eligible to apply

- Must have the intention to take the degree at Uppsala University.
- Must have 30 registered higher education credits at Uppsala University at the time of application. (Being an active full time student!)
- Have attained at least 30 higher education credits at Uppsala University one semester before departure.
- Have attained at least 60 registered higher education credits at Uppsala University by the time of departure.
- Study results are checked in February, June and September. If these requirements are not met, the exchange study offer may be withdrawn



The online application in Moveon

- Certificate of registration showing the current enrolments
- **Transcript of records** from Uppsala University + from any other Swedish university.
- Language test scores (if applicable)
- Certificates showing your participation in welcoming arrangements for new students (Buddy/fadder/mentor) + University wide councils and committees and advisory committees or special posts at a student nation



... The online application in Moveon

- Course proposals for 1-6 universities
- Academic Purpose Statement
- Top grades





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Exemples on valid student representation posts


- University Board (5 student representatives)
- Disciplinary Board (4 student representatives)
- Board for Investigation of Misconduct in Research (2 student representatives)
- Advisory Board for Internationalisation (3 student representatives)
- Reference Group for Student Health Centre (5 student representatives)
- Equality Representative
- Alumni Coordinator
- Archivists Committee



The Selection Process

- Academic Purpose Statement 50%
- Top grades 50% (1-4 points on each)
- Student participation in welcoming arrangements: + 0,1
- Student participation in University wide councils/ committees/ advisory committees and Student Nations: +0,2
- Underrepresented study area in the current round: +0,1
- Previous exchange from Uppsala university: -0,1
- Further Selection methods: Interviews and Lottery







The Selection Process

- 1. First selection round
- 2. Second selection round Reserve places
- 3. Third selection round Still available places

Once you've got an offer... be happy



Academic Purpose Statement (APS)

- Written in the language of instruction you intend to conduct your studies. One (1) APS per language
- Max 600 words
- The score on your APS is based on how well you justify and discuss:

..."how your choice of countries, universities and courses will affect your development of academic and personal skills relevant to your education and future career".



Why write an Academic Purpose Statement?

- Academic cooperation between universities where you are recruited as an exchange student. We need to know what you intend to study and why.
- It's the starting point for you in an important process, where you may reflect over and concretize your plans, goals and expected outcomes of your exchange studies. Starting point of your international experience. You will learn from it.
- To give students with less top grades a better chance.
- Request from several partner universities.





How we process the APS

- The International Officers in the Mobility team reads and evaluates
 all Academic Purpose Statements in Moveon
- Re-readings if necessary as equal assessment is important
- Language expertise within the university
- Feedback







APS Evaluation

The points are distributed as follows:

0 points	Submitted, but not approved, due to poor quality, e.g. written in wrong language
1 points	Very weak academic and professional justification
2 point	Weak or meagre academic and professional justification
3 points	Strong academic and professional justification
4 points	Exceptionally strong academic and professional justification



What to focus on...

- The first hand choice/ the main thread/ the common theme in all your choices
- Academic connection (not vacation/job/staying with relatives)
- Professional connection
- Expected outcomes of your exchange
- Explain <u>why</u> something is important, not just that it's important
- Highlight some of your courses



Soft skills

~ Personal skills that are also applicable in our profession life ~

- The ability to face set-backs
- "To act autonomously even without clear instructions
- To make constructive decisions in situations of strong emotion
- To combine critical thinking with simultaneously being open to other peoples' feelings
- To establish one's credibility in a new group
- Take responsibility for one's health and work situation



What happens after the selection?

- We nominate the students to the host universities.
- We send the students:
- Information on practical matters: (how to apply, application workshops, deadlines etc)
- Information about grants/scholarships
- Certificate of Insurance
- E-mail addresses to other students who approved of sharing them.
- Pre-departure meeting in November/December and in May.



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The format has been changing over the years...

This Corona year: Via Zoom, starting with one session for all outgoing students, general topics: Insurance & If an emergency occurs Swedish Foreign Ministry's recommendations and travel bans CSN Ladok Exchange reports What do do before/during/after the exchange & Checklists Soft skills Transfer of credits

Afterwards: Special zoom meetings for certain regions or universities where special topics can be discussed: Erasmus documentation, grants etc.

Good opportunity to invite guests eg from an Embassy and incoming exchange students so they can meet and exchange experiences!
