

On September 23rd, the Toolkit Consortium gathered on Zoom platform for the Seventh Consortium Meeting. The meeting started with the opening session held by Ms. Giovanna Filippini, TOOLKIT Project coordinator, who welcomed the participants and briefly presented the meeting contents. Followingly, Ms. Lucia Ippolito (Toolkit Coordination Team, UNIBO) announced that the project prolongation proposal submitted to the European

Commission was successfully approved, extending the Toolkit project deadline. A short discussion then followed regarding the necessity of a new organizational plan to be settled.

National Workshop: "A global outlook for Myanmar Universities" (University of Yangon Research Centre, January 11th 2020)

On January 11th 2020, the University of Yangon hosted the TOOLKIT and CHINLONE National Workshop "A global outlook for Myanmar Universities". The event saw the participation of the MM Partners of TOOLKIT and CHINLONE Projects (more info about CHINLONE project available here)

and representatives from the other MM universities of the region. The workshop started with the opening remarks of Dr. Thein Win, Director General, Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Education and Prof. Pho Kaung, Rector, University of Yangon. During the first part of the morning, Prof. Antonio Fiori (CHINLONE Project Coordinator, University of Bologna) held a presentation on the new trends in international relations showing the internationalization strategies and approaches of the University of Bologna. He gave some hints on goals and possible challenges in the implementation of strategic plans and actions for the internationalization of HEIs in the 21st century world.



2. Future collaboration between Myanmar universities on international activities.





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Six possible areas of collaboration



- 1. Sharing international strategies and agreeing common approaches to explaining the system of higher education in Myanmar.
- 2. Sharing best practice in developing websites, prospectuses and other documents used to promote our universities internationally.
- Joint approaches to welcoming and supporting incoming international exchange students: preparing a shared "Study in Myanmar" guide.
- 4. Sharing the experience of international visits: this might include consideration of a joint delegation to international events and conferences.
- 5. Joint training activities on all aspects of international cooperation.
- 6. Setting up a professional group of international cooperation officers.
