Internationalisation through EU Funded Projects: Reaching new heights

Erasmus Projects

- Funded by the European Commission
- Thousands of staff and student mobilities taking place annually since 1987.
- What was earlier confined to mobility within Europe, the programme added global dimension in the subsequent years by encouraging collaborative projects with non-EU partner universities.

- University of Kelaniya first benefitted from an Erasmus Mundus project from 2014 - 2019 that gave mobility opportunities to many students and staff while receiving incoming staff and student mobility from the EU
- Through this project the visibility of University of Kelaniya in the international higher education sector increased rapidly and many new partnerships were established

• Since 2014 over 140 staff and student mobility grants have been secured by the university while receiving over 100 guest professors and administrative staff and a number of students from the EU on incoming mobility

• Since March 2020 more than 2500 students and 100 staff have benefited from Virtual Mobility

Eligibility Criteria for Erasmus Mobility

 Activities related to international affairs, B2/C1 English
- Staff Training: Administrative Staff any officer is eligible if the following criteria can be fulfilled:
- Bachelor Degree, Activities related to international affairs (work related), B2 English
- 1) Selection via online application by the host university
- 2) Nominated by the Head of Department and recommended by the Dean of the Faculty
- 3) Direct invitation by the host university
- 4) Open call for applications via university email/website
- All nominations are approved by the Vice Chancellor
