





- Established in 1942 under the banner of University of Ceylon
- Renamed as University of Peradeniya in 1978
- Largest, residential University in the Country
- 9-Faculties, 79-Departments, 3-PG institutes, 30 Service Centres/ Units
- About 13000 UG-fulltime, 12,000- ODL (Part time) & 8500 PG students



## Challenges



- 1. Negotiating and approving MOUs
- Government regulation changes /time-consuming procedures
- 2. Engaging professors and students in mobility schemes
  - Quality in-campus accommodation for international students,
  - In-campus shopping and good quality dining
  - Language issues with some incoming academics
- 3. Funding grants
  - Hardly any grants from local funding sources
  - Faculty members have a negative attitude towrds application of grants due to difficulties they have to face in financial management
- Present financial regulations too cumbersome and Impractical, sometimes incompatible with granting bodies
